

## FINDINGS & INSIGHTS

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Following are some of the observations and insights:

### ASER with LFW:

- Objective: To compare student levels at the end of the LeapForWord intervention with the national average.
- Methodology: The ASER test was conducted on a randomly selected sample of students from every class where the Elementary Reading Program was deployed.
- Parameters Tested:  
Read Capital Letters | Read Small Letters | Read Simple Words | Meaning of Simple Words | Read Simple Sentences

### ➤ Grade 4 & 5: National Average v/s LFW's Elementary Reading Schools:

4 <sup>th</sup>	42%	86%
5 <sup>th</sup>	49%	86%

Meaning of Words		
Grade	National Average	LFW
4 <sup>th</sup>	60%	96%
5 <sup>th</sup>	60%	100%

Read Sentences		
Grade	National Average	LFW
4 <sup>th</sup>	19%	44%
5 <sup>th</sup>	25%	62%

Meaning of Sentences		
Grade	National Average	LFW
4 <sup>th</sup>	62%	51%
5 <sup>th</sup>	65%	55%

*\*Meaning of Words: Of those who can read words, % children who can tell meaning of the words*

*\*Meaning of Sentences: Of those who can read sentences, % children who can tell meanings of the sentences*

**LFW STUDENTS' HAVE SCORED BETTER THAN ASER NATIONAL AVERAGE IN 3 OUT 4 PARAMETERS**
